About the Sixth International Marine Debris Conference (6IMDC)

Engaging the Global Marine Debris Community

The Sixth International Marine Debris Conference (6IMDC) will take place March 12-16, 2018, in San Diego, California, USA. With a variety of tracks, themes, and session types, this conference will build new partnerships, raise public awareness and support, and inspire follow-up actions that will bring us closer to a world free from the impacts of marine debris.

Building on Our Past Achievements

The Fifth International Marine Debris Conference (5IMDC) was held in Honolulu, Hawaii (2011), bringing together 440 participants representing 38 countries. Attendees participated in workshops, field trips, technical and policy sessions, poster presentations, and panel discussions. Most notably, conference participants refined and endorsed the Honolulu Commitment, which outlined 12 actions to reduce marine debris and led to the development of the Honolulu Strategy, a results-oriented framework strategy to prevent, reduce, and manage marine debris.

During the 6IMDC, participants will conduct a high-level review of the effectiveness and progress of the Honolulu Strategy, highlight success stories and projects, and determine a path forward for new action. The conference will serve as a learning opportunity, offering cross-pollination of ideas between our global stakeholders and thought leaders and emphasizing the diverse solutions to combat the marine debris threat.

Advance the Zero Waste Movement

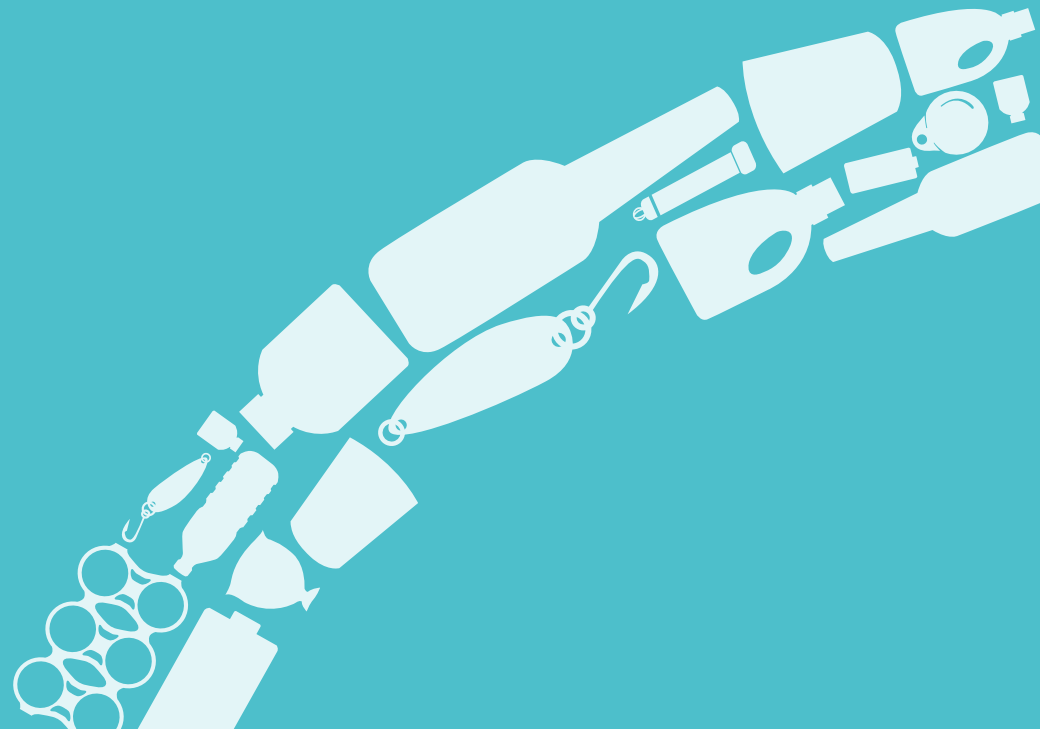

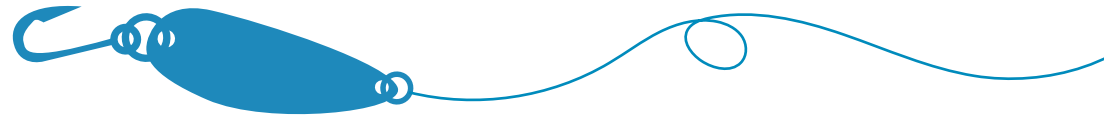
